Sri Sai Balaji Child Welfare & Educational society (No-223 of 2005) is a non-profit organization established on 25th April 2005 with the vision of empowering rural, economically backward, orphaned, semi orphaned and migrant children in and around Puttaparthi Mandal, Sri Sathya Sai District, Andhra Pradesh, India, to enable lives of children to their full potential, with focus on language and literacy development for children.

Why we do, what we do:

Sri Sathya Sai district is one of the most backward districts with draughts and inadequate rainfall every year. With lack of employment and lack of opportunities to earn minimum basic income, even the people in villages find it hard to earn their daily bread & butter and migrate to other cities in search of work with an aim for a better livelihood. The literacy rate is at its lowest in the rural areas, 30-40% of the children are either uneducated or they drop out in primary school after 4th-5th class. As a result, they are largely isolated from mainstream society, unemployed and lead poor quality of lives. In order to develop and improvise their lives by making them self dependent in the most effective way is through education.



We work in three areas:

1) Education:

Education & Literacy programme: We support children age between 5-15 years who come from families with economically poor background, with no prior access to education, children from disabled parents, by enrolling them in the school maintained and run by Sri Sai Balaji Child Welfare & Educational society. We believe access to education in the early ages of children is the key to bringing improvement in their lives.

Our core objective is to bring transformative change in the lives of children through education. We strive hard to ensure that each child acquires language and literacy skills essential to cope with the present competitive world. Along with skills they acquire in their early years through Language & Literacy programme, they also acquire functional skills, skills to be independent and skills to advocate for themselves. All these skills inculcated in their foundation years, further help them to enrol and graduate from degree colleges to get employment opportunities, thereby breaking the vicious cycle of poverty.

2) Providing Mid-day meals:

Most of the parents of children from our school are daily labourers; they leave home early to work and return home late in the evening. Feeding their children with a nutritious meal is a difficult job for them. Due to which many children are underdeveloped physically and are under nourished. In order to prevent this, the school provides the children with a nutritious and healthy meal everyday in the school premises.

3) Free Books, stationary & uniforms:

In order to reduce the burden on the economically backward parents, the school provides books, stationeries and uniforms to the students every academic year. This motivates a lot of parents to enrol their children in our school.

Vision:

Our vision is to educate every child without any discrimination of caste, creed, religion or socioeconomic background by motivating and equipping them with the right skills and tools in their foundational years, in order for them to reach their fullest potential. We aim to achieve this by equipping children to have strong foundational skills and abilities of language and literacy, thinking and reasoning.

Mission:

Our mission is to help children who don't have access to schools and are from poor socio-economic background, to get good education. The focus will be on building a strong foundation for language, leading to age appropriate literacy and educational skills to bring them at par with their peers.

Employment access will be provided through better training programmes at high school level, we aim to provide employable skills like tailoring, carpentry, Handicrafts, computer programming etc.

Strategic approach:

1. Education:

- a) Create a standard knowledge and training curriculum for classrooms, offer language and literacy courses, along with technical skills.
- b) Form partnerships with IT firms to enable technology based education and employable skills for higher and middle school students
- c) Workshop for students on Computers and technology.
- d) Conduct workshop on tailoring with children to equip them with technical and employable skills
- e) Conduct counselling for class 10th and 12th students from our school & other schools to help them understand and explore the opportunities and options available to them based on their skills and interests.

2. Medical And Dental Health Camps:

- a) Medical camp: Post Pandemic, it was essential to guide the students on how to take care of themselves and we did so by adopting the following:
 - Conducted health education lectures and awareness programmes
 - Hand sanitizers were provided to students.
 - Mouth masks were provided to students.
 - Sanitization of school premises was done frequently.
 - Health supplements were given to students.
 - Periodic health check-ups were conducted for students and staff.

b) Dental health Camp:

b) 21st June; International Yoga Day:


The teachers of the school engage students in yoga and meditation practice on daily basis along with a special class on this day to teach them the importance of yoga and its benefits.

c) 15thAugust; Independence Day:


On this Day, Children participate in Flag Hoisting and give speeches about our Independent India and its freedom fighters.

 Students take part in Mathematics Day by making different projects learnt from their curriculum, to show their peers and teachers.





7. Classes on Moral & Human Value:


Along with language and literacy program, students take part in moral and human value classes as part of their curriculum.



10. Parent Workshop:

Parent workshop is conducted to empower our parents by including them in our language and communication support classes, so that they can not only communicate with their own children, but advocate for them wherever required.

11. Career Counselling and Special Classes:

- a) Our school conducts counselling for class 10th and 12th students from our school & other schools to help them understand and explore the opportunities and options available to them based on their skills and interests.
- b) We continue to offer counselling to parents of our students to empower their children to lead lives of full inclusion.
- c) Further, the school managements provided special classes for various entrance examinations such as Eswaramma School, Navodaya School APRJC, Gurukula, RDT Entrance Examinations.

Achievements:

- a) We got 12 Teaching staff And 4 Non teaching staff in our school. Further, 16 staff members and 185 children belonging to almost 150 families are getting benefited through our Society.
- b) The 2022-23 batch of class 10 students were out of school with flying colours, i.e. all 8 students who appeared final exams all passed. The overall result of our school in the academic year 2022-23 was 100%.
